

Our practices reflect our principles which are based upon our values

IN ABSENCE OF SPECIFIC GUIDANCE

- Principles without specified practices
 - Where God has told us what, but not how...
 - Where God has warned, but not listed...
 - Where God gives us guidance, but not rules...
- Brings judgment, opinions and liberty into play
- What principles govern our approach to principles?

TWO PREVAILING ATTITUDES

"I will forgo my liberty to ensure I do not even appear to violate this principle to my brother's hurt"

or

"I get so tired of my brethren applying this principle in a way that infringes upon my liberty"

Which one should it be?

1) GLORIFY GOD IN EVERYTHING

- There is no part of our life that should not glorify God
 - 1 Cor. 10:31 "Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."
 - "Jesus pleased not himself, but gave up all to save men and so glorify God. He is our great exemplar. We must glorify God by sacrificing self for the good of others." David Lipscomb
- Ask ourselves if what we are doing will bring glory to God
- But... we can't just ask ourselves

2) BE AWARE HOW OUR ACTIONS ARE PERCEIVED

- Live honorably in the sight of all men
 - Rom. 12:17 "Respect what is right in the sight of all men."
 - 2 Cor. 8:20-21 "... taking precaution so that no one will discredit us in our administration of this generous gift; for we have regard for what is honorable, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men"
- Jesus went out of His way to not unnecessarily offend others
 - Matt. 17:24-27

3) ACCEPT OUR RESPONSIBILITY TO OTHERS

- Ensure we do not put an obstacle in anyone's way
 - 2 Cor. 6:3 "giving no cause for offense in anything, so that the ministry will not be discredited..."
- Avoid doing things that might make a brother stumble
 - even if they are not wrong in-and-of themselves
 - 1 Cor. 8:9, 11-13
 - 1 Cor. 9:12 "Nevertheless, we did not use this right, but we endure all things so that we will cause no hindrance to the gospel of Christ."


