Regret can have positive impact, if treated correctly

I thank him who has given me strength, Christ Jesus our Lord, because he judged me faithful, appointing me to his service, though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life. For see what earnestness this godly grief has produced in you, but also what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what longing, what zeal, what punishment! At every point you have proved yourselves innocent in the matter. -- II Corinthians 7:9-11

- Taking the "Peter Route"
  - Regret can have positive impact, if treated correctly
    - Regret can push toward becoming more like God

- Taking the "Judas Route"
  - Regret can lead to spiritual suicide
    - Believing God will not/cannot forgive past wrongs
  - Spiritually suicidal because God is rejected
    - In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace – Ephesians 1:7

Produces a state of dissatisfaction

 If only I had married, hadn't married, taken job, not taken job, moved here, moved there......

God does not want us to live like this!

- Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. – Philippians 4:11
- Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." – Heb. 13:5
- But godliness with contentment is great gain
  - -- I Timothy 6:6
