the state or quality of being single

the state of being single

never married, divorced or widowed by choice or by circumstances

the quality of being single

excellence, superiority, value or worth

being single has its advantages (1 Cor. 7:32-35)

being single allows one to have "singleness"

"singleness" is the key to being content "in" being single...

... even if one is not content "with" being single

in a King James kind of way

"The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is **single**, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness.." (Luke 11:34)

single - lit. sincere, simple; figuratively "focused"

"What one chooses to look at or watch and admire begins with the desires of his intellect and spirit. If one **trains his eye** on what is good, Christ and His teaching, he will be properly enlightened and his whole being will be blessed." – C. Caldwell

"singleness of heart" - focus, purpose... true devotion

Definition: "singleness, without folds, like a piece of cloth unfolded" i.e. not compounded or over-complicated (needlessly complex); "single-threaded" (versus "multi-threaded"); "without folds, simple" (J. Thayer)

used of "unworldly simplicity"

Usage: simplicity, sincerity, purity, graciousness.

when your life is not overly complicated:

"As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the **cares of the world** and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful." (Mt. 13:22)

Definition: without rocks (the opposite of phelleus, "rocky land"), i.e. smoothness (a level plain)

(figuratively) what is uncomplicated and unencumbered, i.e. without hindrances or stumbling blocks (J. Thayer).

Usage: simplicity, sincerity.

while you are relatively unencumbered:

"No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him." (2 Tim. 3:4)

in your behavior

"For our boast is this, the testimony of our conscience, that we behaved in the world with **simplicity** and godly sincerity, not by earthly wisdom but by the grace of God, and supremely so toward you." (2 Cor. 1:12)

act with single-minded purpose

to maintain a good conscience toward God out of sincere concern for others

not guided by worldly standards

as trained by the grace of God (Titus 2:11-12)

at work

"Servants, be obedient to them that are your masters according to the flesh, with fear and trembling, in **singleness** of your heart, as unto Christ" (**Eph. 6:5**)

"Servants, obey in all things your masters according to the flesh; not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but in **singleness** of heart, fearing God." (Col. 3:22)

remember who your real Boss is...

"knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ." (Col. 3:24)

in your generosity

"the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in **generosity**..." (Rom. 12:8)

"their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of **generosity**..." (2 Cor. 8:2)

"You will be enriched in every way to be **generous** in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God... they will glorify God because of your submission that comes from your confession of the gospel of Christ, and the **generosity** of your contribution..." (2 Cor. 9:11-13)

in your devotion to Christ

"But I am afraid that, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds will be led astray from the **simplicity** and purity of devotion to Christ..." (2 Cor. 11:3)

don't stray from "the simplicity that is in Christ" (KJV)

"simplicity" (NKJV, ASV, NASB, AMP, LSV, YLT...) the world will influence you toward its ideals of Christ, church, etc. "this worldly"-minded brethren will try to lead you astray

your devotion to the simplicity that is in Christ is a measure of your "sincere and pure devotion to Christ"

toward your brethren

"And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and **singleness** of heart" (Acts 2:46)

continue

regularly, habitually, reliably

pursue and maintain unity

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

(Acts 2:42)

build relationships
