Authority

Authority in Principle

God, as Creator (Gen. 1:1), exercises authority over all creation

Jesus has been given "all authority" (Mt. 28:18)

He reigns as **King**; He rules as **Lord (Acts 2:29-36) Head** of the church **(Col. 1:18)** *"For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me."* **(John 6:38)**

Holy Spirit given to provide revelation and confirmation (John 14-16)

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." (John 14:26)

"When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (16:13ff)

Direct line of authority from *Father* to *Son* (via *Holy Spirit*) to *Apostles*

Authority in Action

Jesus to the Apostles...

"In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up, **after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen.**" (Acts 1:1-2)

How the Apostles understood their role...

"When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has **now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit**." (Eph. 3:4-5)

"that you should remember the predictions of the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior through your apostles" (2 Pet. 3:2)

Authority in Action

The Apostles understood they were setting the church *"in order"*

"This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order" (Titus 1:5)

"I hope to come to you soon, but I am writing these things to you so that, if I delay, you may know how one ought to behave in the household of God, which is the church of the living God, a pillar and buttress of the truth" (1 Tim. 3:14-15) "I sent you Timothy... to remind you of my ways in Christ, as I teach them everywhere in every church." (1 Cor. 4:17)

"This is my rule in all the churches" (1 Cor. 7:17)

"we have no such practice, nor do the churches of God." (1 Cor. 11:16)

"... about the other things I will give directions when I come." (1 Cor. 11:34) "Now concerning the collection for the saints: as I directed the churches of Galatia, so you also are to do." (1 Cor. 16:1)

Authority in Action

How the church understood the Apostles' role...

"And **they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching** and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." (Acts 2:42)

The church was built on the foundation of Apostolic authority

"the household of God, **built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets**, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone..." (Eph 2:19-20)

"So then, brothers, stand firm and **hold to the traditions that you were taught** by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter." (2 Thess. 2:15)

*"Follow the pattern of sound words which you have heard from me, in the faith and love which is in Christ Jesus***" (2 Tim. 1:13)**

Authority in Expectation (Col. 1)

When we pray for you (9-10) we ask that you be filled with:

- "the knowledge of His will" a safeguard against <u>unrevealed</u> ideas
- "all spiritual wisdom" a safeguard against human wisdom
- All spiritual "understanding" to guide in a Christian's decision making
 - <u>So that</u> you will know how "to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord"
 - So that you will know what is "fully pleasing to Him"
 - <u>So that</u> you will bear fruit "in every good work"
 - How do we know what is a good work?
 - "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." (2 Tim. 3:16-17)
- <u>Thus</u>, increasing in your <u>knowledge</u> of God (10)

Authority in Expectation (Eph. 5)

So then, be very careful how you walk (15-17)
