

John 20:1-9

- John is the other apostle, the one whom Jesus loved
 John 21:20, 24
- John saw and believed (9)
 - Then, he is characteristically, endearingly honest (2:18-22)
- He did not believe because of prophetic Scripture:
 - Psalm 16:10
 - Isa. 53:10
- He did not believe because of what Jesus had said...

After Peter confessed "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" **Matthew 16:21** From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he **must** go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day **be raised**.

Mark 8:31 And he began to teach them that the Son of Man **must** suffer many things and <u>be rejected</u> by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days **rise** again.

32 And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

Luke 9:22 "The Son of Man **must** suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day **be raised**."

After His Transfiguration

Matthew 17:22 As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man **is about to be** delivered into the hands of men, **23** and they will kill him, and **he will be raised** on the third day." And they were <u>greatly distressed</u>.

Mark 9:31 he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man **is going to be** delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days **he will rise**." **32** But they did not understand the saying and were afraid to ask him.

Luke 9:44 "Let these words sink into your ears: The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men." 45 But they did not understand this saying, and it was concealed from them, so that they might not perceive it. And they were afraid to ask him about this saying.

As they were going up to Jerusalem for His final time

Matthew 20:18 "See, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death 19 and deliver him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified, and he will be raised on the third day."

Mark 10:33 "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man **will be** delivered over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death and deliver him over to the Gentiles. **34** And they will mock him and <u>spit on him</u> and flog him and kill him. And after three days **he will rise**."

Luke 18:31 See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. 32 For he will be delivered over to the Gentiles and will be mocked and shamefully treated and spit upon. 33 And after flogging him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise." 34 But they understood none of these things. This saying was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said.


- On the first day of the week
