







We the People

insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do hereby establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

establish Justice,

Section. 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section. 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within the Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including Indians bound to Service for a Term of Years, and excluding Indians not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons. The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years, in such Manner as they shall direct.

The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand, but each State shall have at Least one Representative; and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

When vacancies happen in the Representation from any State, the Executive thereof shall issue Writ of Election to fill such Vacancies.

The House of Representatives shall chuse their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.

Section. 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have one Vote.

Immediately after they shall be seated in Consequence of the first Election, they shall be divided as nearly as may be into three Clases. The Seats of the Senators of the first Class shall be vacated at the Expiration of the first Year, of the second Class at the Expiration of the second Year, and of the third Class at the Expiration of the third Year, so that one third may be chosen every second Year; but if a Vacancy happen by Resignation, or otherwise, during the Term of any Senator, the Electors of that State shall fill the Vacancy.

Receipts of the Legislature of any State, the Executive thereof shall fill the Vacancies.

No Person shall be a Senator who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, and seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.

The Vice President of the United States shall be President of the Senate, but shall have no Vote, unless he be equally divided. The Senate shall chuse their other Officers, and a President pro tempore, in the Absence of the Vice President, or when he shall exercise the Office of President of the United States.

The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments, when called for that Purpose, they shall be on Oath or Affirmation. When the President of the United States is tried, the Chief Justice shall preside: and no Person shall be a Senator who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, and seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.

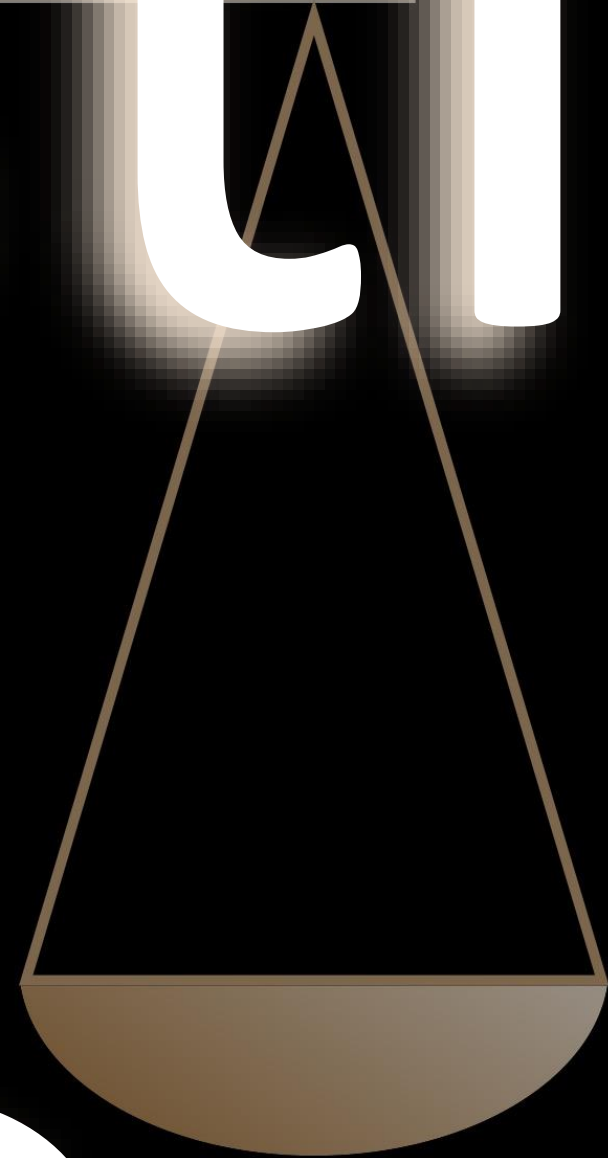
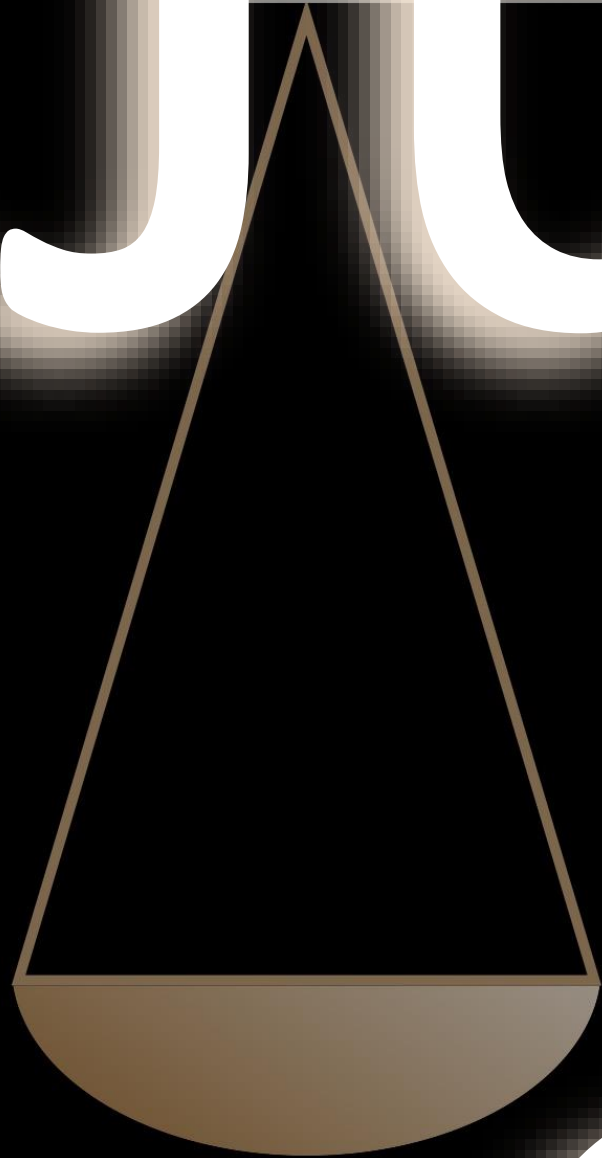
Judgment in Cases of Impeachment shall not extend further than to remove the Officer from Office, and disqualify him to hold and enjoy any Office of Honor, Trust or Profit under the United States: but the Party convicted shall nevertheless be liable to Indictment, Trial, Judgment and Punishment, according to Law.

20 You shall follow what is altogether just, that you may live and inherit the land which the Lord your God is giving you.

# WHAT JUSTICE LOOKS LIKE

## Exodus 23

- 1 You shall not circulate a false report. Do not put your hand with the wicked to be an unrighteous witness.
- 2 You shall not follow a crowd to do evil; nor shall you testify in a dispute so as to turn aside after many to pervert justice.
- 3 You shall not show partiality to a poor man in his dispute.
- 4 If you meet your enemy's ox or his donkey going astray, you shall surely bring it back to him again.
- 5 If you see the donkey of one who hates you lying under its burden, and you would refrain from helping it, you shall surely help him with it.





# WHAT JUSTICE LOOKS LIKE

## Exodus 23

- 6 You shall not pervert the judgment of your poor in his dispute.
- 7 Keep yourself far from a false matter; do not kill the innocent and righteous. For I will not justify the wicked.
- 8 And you shall take no bribe, for a bribe blinds the discerning and perverts the words of the righteous.
- 9 “Also you shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the heart of a stranger, because you were strangers in the land of Egypt.



# WHAT JUSTICE LOOKS LIKE

## Deuteronomy 10

17 For the Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality nor takes a bribe.

18 He administers justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the stranger, giving him food and clothing.

19 Therefore love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.



# THE CRIES OF THE PROPHETS

## Micah 3

- 1 And I said: "Hear now, O heads of Jacob,  
And you rulers of the house of Israel:  
Is it not for you to know justice?"
- 2 You who hate good and love evil;  
Who strip the skin from [a]My people,  
And the flesh from their bones;
- 3 Who also eat the flesh of My people, flay their skin from them,  
Break their bones, and chop them in pieces
