18 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed 19 to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord."

-Luke 4:18-19

"...to preach the gospel to the poor"

- Jesus showed compassion for and was received by the poor
 - Not many rich obey the gospel (Mt. 19:23)
 - "not many wise...not many mighty...not many noble" (1 Cor. 1:26)
- Isaiah 61:1 refers to the "meek" (KJV) or "afflicted" (NASB)
- Jesus has in mind those who are "poor in spirit"
 - "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
 - (Mt. 5:3)
 - "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth."
 - (Mt. 5:5)

"...to proclaim release to the captives"

- Those who need the gospel are prisoners
 - Prisoners to sin (Rom. 6:6)
 - Prisoners to death (Rom. 6:9)
 - Christ sets free from spiritual bondage (Rom. 6:16-22)
 - He liberates those who were "helpless" on their own (Rom. 5:6)
- Jesus offers freedom from sin and death

"you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (Jn. 8:32)

"and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty" (2 Cor. 3:17)

"to proclaim... recovery of sight to the blind"

To open the eyes of the spiritually blind

"And Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, so that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind." Those of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these things and said to Him, "We are not blind too, are we?" Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but since you say, 'We see,' your sin remains." (John 9:49)

"HE HAS BLINDED THEIR EYES AND HE HARDENED THEIR HEART, SO THAT THEY WOULD NOT SEE WITH THEIR EYES AND PERCEIVE WITH THEIR HEART, AND BE CONVERTED AND I HEAL THEM." (John 12:40)

"... to set free those who are oppressed"

- To liberate those who have been crushed and broken by sin
 - Sin destroys
 - Sin brings misery
 - Sin brings shame
 - Sin brings guilt
 - Sin "presses down" on the contrite
- Christ restores those who come to Him
- He relieves the pressure...

"... to proclaim the favorable year of the Lord"

- An allusion to the Year of Jubilee (Lev. 25:8-17)
 - Bond servants were set free and seized land was returned
 - "intended to typify the messianic liberation" Butler
- To announce that the promised deliverance has come

"On that day the deaf will hear words of a book, and out of their gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind will see. The afflicted also will increase their gladness in the Lord, and the needy of mankind will rejoice in the Holy One of Israel." (Isa. 29:18-19)

"Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."
