

- "Therefore" a conclusion based upon a principle just established
- James 4:13-17
  - "but probably the apostle meant that it should refer to the point specified in the previous verses - the forming of plans respecting the future." - Barnes
- Sin of presumptuous confidence regarding tomorrow
  - When we know our future depends upon God
  - To know to walk humbly but in practice to ignore it is sin

- Therefore if this principle has a more general application...
  - ... it is in the **context** of not assuming we have tomorrow
  - We should <u>not</u> put off or pass up an opportunity "to do good"
  - We know "to do good" whenever we get an opportunity
  - We know we may not have that opportunity tomorrow
- MAIN POINT: The phrase "to do good" has situational application as opposed to absolute application

- "Good" sounds absolute (good vs. evil); a conceptual infinitive
  - any and all the good that could possibly be done
- "Good" here "is not the idea of good" Wiesinger
  - a description of the act required in a given situation
  - "to do" to perform or accomplish STRONG's
- We are not talking abstractly about any and all good that could be done, but the goodness of an action in a particular situation

- The Problem: if we feel guilt when we do not do all "the good"
- The Root of the Problem: "Am I doing enough?"
  - Question implies there is an amount that is enough
  - Mindset suggests there is a standard which I can achieve
  - We're right back to pursuing self-righteousness
- The Answer: what counts is the nature of our works not the number

Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin. (KJV)

Therefore, to one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, to him it is sin. (NASB)

So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin. (ESV)

- "to do good" sounds absolute
- "the right thing to do" depends on the situation or opportunity

- James is reinforcing something he has already taught (2:16-17)
- 16 And one of you say unto them, Depart in peace, be ye warmed and filled; notwithstanding ye give them not those things which are needful to the body; what doth it profit?
- An opportunity when we know the right thing to do but don't do it!
- 17 Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone.

- What does opportunity look like?
  - Abraham sitting in the door of his tent (Gen. 18:1-5)
  - The Good Samaritan traveling along the road (Luke 10:33)
- We may not always have opportunity Phil. 4:10
  - Paul knew the Philippians would do good, when they did...
- We may not be in position to respond to opportunity 1 Cor. 16:12
  - Paul had confidence Apollos would do good, when he could...
- What should we do when we see an opportunity? 1 John 3:17-18
  - "Little children, let us... love in deed and truth."

Don't pass up an opportunity when we know the right thing to do

9 Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary. 10 So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, and especially to those who are of the household of the faith. (Gal. 6:9-10)

- What should we do when we have opportunity?
  - Do what we know to do...
  - Do good
  - Do the right thing to do
