Victim Mentality

- Are there victims? Absolutely!
 - But you do see, for you note mischief and vexation, that you may take it into your hands; to you the helpless commits himself; you have been the helper of the fatherless
 - Psalm 10:14



Victim Mentality

- Victim mentality defined:
 - "Belief that one is always a victim: the idea that bad things will always happen to one."
 - Someone (thing) keeps life from getting better
- Is this how God wants life viewed?



Joseph's Children

Manasseh: "Forgetting"

 "God has <u>made me forget</u> all my hardship and all my father's house." – Genesis 41:51b

- Ephraim: "Fruitful"
 - "God has <u>made me fruitful</u> in the land of my affliction." Genesis 41:52b

Overcoming Victim Mentality: Forget and Remember

- Gave no Place to Self-Pity
 - "A self-indulgent dwelling on one's sorrows"


- Gave no Place to Self-Pity
 - Easy for good people to fall into this temptation
 - [Elijah] said, "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. For the people of Israel have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword, and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away."

Self-pity: exploring the links to personality, control beliefs, and anger Dr. Joachim Stoeber

- High level of Self-pity...
 - Viewed self as controlled by chance/powerful others
 - Viewed self as defenseless
 - High in emotional loneliness
 - High in anger rumination

He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God? – Genesis 39:9

- Allowed Himself to Forget
 - Victim mentality relives bad situations over and over
 - Times when another is blamed for bad outcome
 - Bitterness and hate allowed to grow
 - Thinks others have much better situation



- Allowed Himself to Forget
 - Note how Paul overcame
 - Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own.
 But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead. – Philippians 3:13

- Allowed Himself to Forget
 - Joseph came to terms with past and moved forward
 - Demonstrated what God does in forgetting sins
 - Did not waste precious time in perpetual hurt
 - He entrusted God with his future
 - How, though, can this be done?

Occam's Razor The simplest explanation is usually the correct one.

Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble – Matthew 6:34

- Don't War Against Reality
 - Life is not fair or unfair: life is life!
 - Blaming others for unhappiness...
 - Causes loss of touch with reality
 - Creates perpetual state of unhappiness

- Don't War Against Reality
- Turn Vengeance Over to God
 - He will deal with victimizers
 - Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord. – Romans 12:19
 - Leaves us free to do good/forget painful past

- Don't War Against Reality
- Turn Vengeance Over to God
- Trust God to Create Good Conclusion
